WESTWON, away in front to contest the pace three or four wide, battled with NO TRIPPIN through the drive and outgamed that one under strong handling. NO TRIPPIN gained a slight edge inside early, dueled with the winner into deep stretch and was outfinished. WINYAH, well placed in behind the dueling leaders from early on, was steadied in tight leaving the three-sixteenths pole and couldn't offer the needed late response. BIG CHIEF stalked the dueling leaders four or five wide, made a bold run into the final furlong but couldn't sustain the effort. BRILLIANT BID, outrun for a half, came out six wide for the drive and finished willingly. GOLD STERLING, five or six wide, had no rally. OUR SACRED HONOR broke sluggishly, was steadied in tight quarters, was outrun to the lane and passed tired foes. PHIL THE POWER failed to rally in an even effort. GLACKITY GLACK, steadied after a sluggish start, never reached contention. TAKEDOWN raced near the inside and tired. RED FALCON, up close between foes early and four wide, continued forwardly until the final quarter, drifted out eight wide and was finished. MATSIBI angled in early to force the pace four or five wide, battled up close for a half and tired.
